A Notch above the Rest

Situated at Sadhu Bet near Sardar Sarovar Dam, the Statue of Unity is the World's Tallest Statue (182 mts.) paying a fitting tribute to Sardar Vallabh Bhai Patel, the 'Iron Man' of India. This colossal monument is an ode to his visionary statesmanship and shall stand as a beacon to future generations and as the pride of India.


Get the pre-historic angle up close


India's first World Heritage City

Ahmedabad's World Heritage City status is quite befitting. Its value, glory and magnificence will be preserved more and showcased for the amazement of visitors from around the world. The important heritage structures of Ahmedabad include the Pol, Bhadra Fort, Sidi Saiyyed Mosque, Jhulta Minar, Dada Hari Ni Vav, Kalupur Swaminarayan Mandir, Calico Dome, Teen Darwaza, and the Jama Masjid.

Live the bygone era

Visit the extravagant Maharaja Palace which is four times the size of the Buckingham Palace and was built by Maharaja Sayajirao Gaekwad III in 1890. Within this royal palace, one can view a remarkable collection of old armory and spectacular sculptures in bronze, marble and terracotta by Fellici.

Enlighten your being

Explore one of the twelve Jyotirlinga shrines of God Shiva where your soul gets elevated with the chanting of prayers and the roaring of the waves. This ancient temple is believed to have been ingeniously built in 4 phases - first in gold by Lord Soma, in silver by Ravi, in wood by Lord Krishna and in stone by King Bhimdeva.

Discover the doors to heaven and salvation

Discover one of the seven holiest places of Hindus in India. The legendary Dwarkadhish temple has two 'dwars' (doors)-'Swarg Dwar' (door to heaven) for pilgrims to enter and 'Moksha Dwar' (door to salvation) to exit. Located at the 'sangam' (confluence) of the Gomati river and the Arabian Sea, this temple has been submerged six times and resurrected from ruins.

Get blessed by Goddess of power and prosperity

Situated on the summit of Gabber Hill, near the Vedic, virgin Saraswati river on the hills of the Arasur forest is the legendary holy Ambaji temple. A Holy Lamp is constantly burning in this hill temple facing Visa Shree Yantra of Nij Mandir of Mata Shri Arasuri Ambica.

Converse with the gods

Built as an abode for the Gods this miraculous temple city is located at the pinnacle of Shatrunjaya hills with 3,800 steps to reach. The importance of this blessed region is reflected in the fact that there are cluster of 1,300 Jain temples and more than 27,000 idols of Jain Gods on this mountain alone. It is considered the most sacred pilgrimage place by the Jain community where pilgrims ascend to the heavens, seeking their path to enlightenment. Exquisitely carved in marble is the main temple on top of the hill, which is dedicated to 1st Tirthankar Lord Adinath.

Bath in Sacred Sunshine

Intricately carved and articulately designed this historic Sun temple is dedicated to the Hindu Sun-God: Surya. What is remarkable is that at dawn during the equinoxes the sun's rays illuminate the sanctum sanctorum.


Visit the picturesque pilgrimage place

Pavagadh is one of the biggest tourist and pilgrimage place in the state of Gujarat. Located at a distance of 55 kms from the city of Vadodara, the entire area is mainly forest land and very picturesque. There are also many sacred sites which attract millions every year. Kalika Mata Temple, Machi Haveli, Temple of Kali and Sadanshah Pir Dargah are sites worth visiting.

Journey back in time

Located at the foothills of Pavagadh, Champaner is one of the world heritage site of Gujarat. The main attraction is the ancient fort of Champaner which is surrounded by lower hillocks, escarpments and plateau, all resulting from volcanic eruptions and flowing lava. The entire landscape for miles around is scattered with pastoral surroundings of fort walls, tombs, gardens, arches, pillars and wells. What is more, Champaner has been inscripted by UNESCO as World Heritage in 2004. Major sites: Shehar ki Masjid, Jami Masjid, Kewada and Nagina Masjid.


Sensational Heights - Asia's longest ropeway

Known for its strategic strength, the fort famously survived a 12-year siege. Today, Uparkot Fort invites visitors to explore its enduring history and architectural marvels.


Embrace the Environs


Desert Kaleidoscope


Soulmate Quest

The Tarnetar Fair, spanning three days in the Bhadarva month, is an annual matchmaking ritual inspired by Draupadi's Swayamvar, which is believed to have occurred here. Ras dances extend to the surrounding areas, uniting people in joyful celebration. Recently, the fair has expanded to include a rural Olympics, offering various sports and competitions for added entertainment.
