




International Kite Festival

The Trinetrishwar Temple holds mythological significance, as it is here Arjuna performed the Matsyavedh (fish-catching) ritual and won the hand of Draupadi.



In March, the Kavant Fair brings together the Rathva tribe for a lively harvest celebration, showcasing Gujarat's tribal culture.


Tribes from Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh join in for colourful dances, melodious tunes, and the lively spirit of the Rathva community.



Known as the Festival of Costumes for its vibrant tribal attire, it offers a rich cultural experience with the Kunbis, Bhils, Gamits, and Warlis communities.

Visitors can explore all 51 Shaktipeeths, otherwise scattered across the Indian subcontinent. Devotees often undertake a journey on foot for days, carrying sacred flags to express their unwavering faith.

The Fair features local food, Garba dance in the temple premises, and a grand procession of Goddess Ambaji.

Madhavpur Fair near Porbandar celebrates the divine marriage of Lord Krishna and Rukminiji, blending Northeastern and Western Indian cultures.


The event highlights Rukminiji's journey from Arunachal Pradesh to Gujarat, with performances by the Mishmi Tribe.





Each year, thousands gather at Bhavnath Mahadev Temple near Mount Girnar, for a five-day Mahashivratri celebration. This auspicious festival commemorates Shiva's cosmic Tandav dance of destruction and creation.

At midnight, naga bavas (naked sadhus) ride ornamented elephants in a grand procession (also known as Ravedi), marking the start of sacred rituals. Witnessing the naga sadhus and taking a holy dip in Mrugi Kund are considered highly auspicious.

Known as the Mini Kumbh, the fair bursts with energy, featuring dance, Bhavai, and musical performances, offering an unforgettable spiritual experience.

It is believed that Shiva himself graces the shrine during the Bhavnath Fair.


